

LOGLINE

Artist David Huggins lost his virginity to an Extra-Terrestrial woman. This is his story.

SHORT SYNOPSIS

The strange story of David Huggins, a 73 year-old New Jersey man who claims to have had a lifetime of encounters with otherworldly beings - including an interspecies romance with an extraterrestrial woman (with whom he lost his virginity to), and chronicled it all in surreal impressionist paintings, few of which have ever been seen. Filmed in an intimate, nonjudgemental style, Love and Saucers lets David tell his story, and in turn lets the audience decide what is fact, fiction, and everything in-between.

LONG SYNOPSIS

73 year-old David Huggins lives a quiet, solitary life in Hoboken, NJ. He spends his days painting landscapes and still-lives, tidying up the house, and working part-time in a local deli. But David's mild-mannered exterior belies a truly mystifying story.

Since childhood, he's experienced a lifetime of bizarre yet benevolent encounters with otherworldly beings, including a six-foot tall praying mantis, child-like grays, and an impossibly tall man. Among them is Crescent, a beautiful E.T. female with whom he loses his virginity at 17. Over the years their relationship blossoms into an interspecies romance. At the intense height of this relationship (hybrid children!), they suddenly leave him to face the world alone, and to an outside life that has been left in shambles. Now he leads a life between two worlds, left to try and make sense of both.

As self-therapy David's chronicled these encounters in surreal impressionist paintings. And it's through these striking, bizarre, and sometimes (often) uncomfortable paintings that his story is visually told, transporting us into his surreal world. Conversations with family, friends, co-workers, and experts reveal surprising insights into the ultimate question: what really happened to David? Are his experiences dream, hallucination, or can they be real? Was it his challenging childhood of alcoholic parents in the stifling rural South? Is it a psychiatric disorder, or something neurological? One thing is for certain, to David, these encounters are as real as the ground beneath his feet.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

My inaugural conversation with David Huggins started like this:

"Well Brad, I don't know much, but what I know for sure is at 17 I lost my virginity to an extra terrestrial woman."

And with those words cemented my desire to make make a documentary of his story.

I first heard of David while listening to a radio interview with an investigator of UFO abductions. He made brief mention of a man from Hoboken who'd had intimate relations with an ET and fathered multiple space babies, chronicling it all through a series of paintings. It was too strange to forget, and after some research I uncovered his story and some of his art. Each paintings conveys a cinematic story, and together a compelling narrative for a film I just had to realize. After tracking him down through a neighbor (David does not use the internet), our now 5 year-long relationship was borne.

Although I'm still not sure just what to make of David's story, I do know for certain he is a kind, humble, and honest man. And what I do believe is that David is being genuine that he experienced something supernatural.

I have long been fascinated by stories of abductions and extraterrestrial contact, questioning whether these are psychological or physiological phenomena. With what we currently know about neurology and the effect of mind over matter, the distinction between the two becomes increasingly murky. Although David's story is about the unique experiences of one man, it has quite the implications on how we all perceive reality, both the ordinary and non-ordinary kind. As soon as we find out if aliens really do exist, the next questions will invariably be "can we procreate with them?" Who isn't interested in a little cross-species ET sex?





BIOS



Brad Abrahams (director + editor) is a documentary filmmaker and commercial director from Canada, currently based in the USA. His all-consuming interests in radical science, cryptozoology, and general esoterica inspire his stories. <u>Love and Saucers</u> is his first feature-length film, with two others in production and post (<u>Cryptozoologist</u> and <u>On the Back of a Tiger</u>). Though he has not yet had a supernatural experience, he is ready and willing. Fruit is his favorite food.



Matt Ralston (Producer) is a producer with <u>Curator Pictures</u> in Seattle WA. He has been working in the production and advertising world for 15+ years as a producer and editor. He is currently producing the feature-length documentary <u>Cryptozoologist</u> with Brad Abrahams, and creating a puppet web series called <u>Get Outta Here!</u> He built a tiki bar in his basement called Scully's Rum Locker.



Munn Powell (Cinematographer) has been shooting commercials, documentaries and feature films for 18 years. He currently holds a position as a lecturer in Communication and Design at the Utrecht University of Applied Sciences, and is a cool guy to work with.

David Huggins (star) is a 74 year-old year old painter who lives in Hoboken, NJ. He studied at the Art Students League in New York City, but is mostly self-taught. When not painting he works part-time in a local deli and collects and watches sci-fi and horror VHS tapes for his two thousand strong collection. He's been divorced for 20 years, though he still lives with his ex-wife. He has a son who lives in Thailand. David concentrates most of his talent on the creation of a series of paintings chronicling his life-long experience as an alien abductee.


